Candidates for Church Board, 2021-2023 Term

Members will be asked to vote for three to serve with continuing Board members, Steve Arredondo, Lisa Barnes, Enid Eck, and Eduardo Suastegui.

Sandy Duran

Sandy is a registered nurse working at PIH-Health, Whittier. She and her husband, Bobby, have been members at WACC for over two years. She was born and raised in a Christian home. At the age of six, she made a decision to ask Jesus into her heart while at the school she was attending, Montebello Baptist School. Throughout life, she has weathered difficult seasons, yet her faith remained unwavering. Her understanding of God's constant character keeps her eyes fixed on Him. She enjoys serving behind the scenes and has done so in the nursery, Sunday



school, women's ministry, as a greeter, and part of the welcome team.

As an encourager, she communicates value to others, and sees that as an important role should she be selected to serve on the Board. With twenty-three years of experience as a nurse, she's worked with a variety of people, watching for God to lead her to encourage and be a positive voice for hope in Him. She sees God at work at WACC in the youth ministries, and is excited to see God do amazing things in the next generation. Kathi Lundstrom

Dr. Kathi Lundstrom is an elementary school teacher in the Norwalk-La Mirada School district, with a Ph.D. in Gifted Education. She became a charter member of WACC in



1971. She is married to Ed. At four-years-old, in Children's Church at Bethany Baptist Church, Whittier, her teacher explained how Jesus loves her, died for her sins, and wanted to be her Friend forever. At that moment, it made sense to her, and she asked Jesus into her life that Sunday morning.

Over the past forty-nine years, she has held many leadership and ministry positions at WACC including Sunday School Superintendent, Bible Study Leader, Deaconess Board, MET Team Leader, Jr. High staff, Adult Sunday School class president, and Confident Kids parenting facilitator. She has

participated in choirs, short-term missions trips, and many other ministry opportunities. She has a broad-spectrum knowledge and understanding of WACC, its history, and its people. One of her spiritual gifts is administration. She has been told she has the ability to prayerfully lead others as they all serve God together. She thinks clearly and logically and is able to articulate her thoughts and the opinions of others well. She understands that, as a Board, the desire is to serve God and WACC in a way that is biblically aligned and honoring the Lord.

Forty-nine years at WACC gives her a relatively unique perspective to see the workings of God over that long stretch of time. She remembers the early days when God brought a group of people together, providing a meeting place in a junior high, a pastor, and a more permanent location later. WACC has honored the Lord with a commitment to global ministries, a commitment to fiscal responsibility, and a desire to "bring Jesus to people and people to Jesus." The Lord continues to work in and through this church to that end, as seen in so many lives brought to Him through the ministries of WACC.

Mark Oliver

Mark is a Senior Real Estate Review Appraiser with JPMorgan Chase Bank. He and his wife, Patti, have been members of WACC since 1984. He was raised in a Christian home and realized as a child that following Christ required a personal step of faith. He shared that he "officially" gave his life to Christ at the Billy Graham Crusade held in Anaheim in

At the age of 9, his parents took the whole family to a local Whittier Church, First Family, to hear a pastor from Sri Lanka speak. He spoke about Satan, demonic spirits, and Hell. Rick decided that he did not want to go there, so he went forward and accepted Christ. He says he was scared into salvation. Later that evening, his mother shared with him about God's Love and what salvation meant, so he prayed again and asked God into his life.

Bobby is an experienced Event Production Manager and Creative Director. He currently runs his own consulting company & works at UPS. He is married to Sandy and has been a






